## Theatres in Bari

### Teatro Petruzzelli

- **Location:** Corso Cavour, Bari
- **Overview:** As the largest theatre in Bari and the fourth largest in Italy, Teatro Petruzzelli is a historic opera house renowned for its opulent interiors and exceptional acoustics. Inaugurated in 1903, it has hosted numerous prestigious performances, including operas, ballets, and concerts. The theatre was tragically damaged by fire in 1991 but was meticulously restored and reopened in 2009. Wikipedia

### Teatro Margherita

- **Location:** Old Port Area, Bari
- **Overview:** Built between 1912 and 1914, Teatro Margherita is a historic theatre constructed on stilts over the sea. After serving as a theatre and cinema until 1979, it was repurposed as a museum. Its unique location and architectural design make it a significant landmark in Bari. Wikipedia

### AncheCinema

- **Location:** Corso Italia, 112, Bari
- **Overview:** AncheCinema is a modern, multifunctional venue housed in a renovated historical building within a former railway station. It hosts a variety of events, including live theatre, cinema screenings, concerts, and private functions. The venue is noted for its accessibility features, including a unique platform that accommodates up to 36 wheelchair users, making it a model for inclusive design in Europe. - **Location:** Bari

## Museum in Bari

### Museo Archeologico di Santa Scolastica

- **Location:** Piazzale Cristoforo Colombo, 70122 Bari
- **Overview:** Housed in a medieval Benedictine monastery with a 16th-century bastion, this museum offers a journey through time, from the 19th century back to the Protohistoric era. The collection includes artifacts from the Daunian, Peucetian, and Messapian civilizations, as well as Greek, Byzantine, and medieval relics. Recent exhibitions have blended contemporary art with archaeology, enhancing the visitor experience. Museo Archeologico Santa Scolastica
- **Hours:** Open daily from 10:00 to 17:00 (closed on Tuesdays).

### Museo Civico di Bari

- **Location:** Bari Vecchia, in a medieval tower
- **Overview:** Established in 1919, the museum showcases the city's history from the Renaissance onward. Highlights include the caricature collection by Frate Menotti and a historical photographic archive. Additionally, it houses a civic library with over 13,000 volumes.

## Museo di Scienze della Terra

- **Location:** Via E. Orabona, 4, 70125 Bari
  - **Overview:** Affiliated with the University of Bari, this museum offers insights into Earth's evolution, focusing on Puglia's geological history. It features two main sections: geopaleontological and mineralogical-petrographic. Visits are by appointment, typically from Monday to Friday, 9:00 to 13:00. ISPRA

## Food in bari

## Pasta Dishes

- **Orecchiette alle cime di rapa**  
The signature dish of Bari! Orecchiette ("little ears" pasta) served with sautéed turnip greens (cime di rapa), garlic, chili, and olive oil. Simple but packed with flavor.
  - **Spaghetti all'Assassina**  
A spicy, pan-fried spaghetti dish that's crispy on the outside and tender inside. It's bold and unique, a real local favorite.

## Street Food & Snacks

- **Panzerotti**

Fried pockets of dough stuffed with tomato, mozzarella, and sometimes other fillings like ham or spinach. Think of them like Italian calzones, perfect for a quick and tasty bite.

- **Focaccia Barese**

A soft, thick focaccia bread topped with tomatoes, olives, and oregano. Great as a snack or alongside a meal.

## **Seafood**

- **Fresh fish and seafood**

Being a coastal city, Bari offers fantastic fresh seafood. Grilled fish, fried calamari, and seafood pasta dishes are staples here.

- **Tiella Barese**

A layered casserole made with rice, potatoes, mussels, onions, and tomatoes. It's hearty, comforting, and truly a Bari specialty.

Fried dough pastries shaped into spirals or roses, soaked in vincotto (a cooked grape must syrup) or honey.

- **Pasticciotto**

A pastry filled with creamy custard—popular throughout Apulia and definitely worth a try.
